1. Royal Castle

The Royal Castle in Warsaw, a historic symbol of Poland's statehood, served as the official residence of Polish monarchs for centuries. Meticulously reconstructed after its destruction during World War II, the castle today houses a rich collection of art, historical artifacts, and period interiors, offering a unique insight into Poland's cultural and political heritage.

2. Viewing Terrace of the Palace of Culture and Science

One of the highest and most recognisable building in Warsaw can be seen from almost every part of the capital. It was opened in 1955 on the initiative of Joseph Stalin as a "gift of the Soviet people for the Poles". Its viewing terrace, located on the upper floors, offers panoramic views of Warsaw, providing a unique perspective of the city's urban landscape.

4. Warsaw Rising Museum

A unique place that helps visitors understand contemporary Warsaw. This interactive museum commemorates the largest underground combat operation in German-occupied Europe during World War II. The multimedia exhibition reflects the atmosphere of the Uprising, shows the military history of the 63 days of fighting, the everyday life of civilians and describes the post-war communist terror.

The museum restores the memory of their rich culture and heritage.

Łazienki Garden

The Royal Łazienki Gardens in Warsaw are a historic palace-and-park complex combining classical architecture, landscaped gardens, and natural scenery. At the heart of the park is the summer residence of the last king of Poland – Stanisław August Poniatowski. In the grounds of Łazienki you will also see an orangery, an amphitheatre, a court theatre, the Museum of Hunting and Horse-riding, the Myślewicki Palace and numerous free-standing sculptures.

University of Warsaw Library Garden

The popular library is one of the most interesting buildings in Poland. The combination of raw concrete, green glass and lush vegetation growing on the facade of the library makes a great impression. The biggest attraction is the impressive roof garden, one of the largest and most beautiful of its kind in Europe. The university garden is available from spring to autumn. From the bridges and observation deck you will not only see the breath-taking panorama of Warsaw, but you will also get a bird's eye view of the interior of the library.
